On June 22nd, the US Supreme Court made the disturbing decision to overturn Roe v Wade and revoke the Constitutional right to abortion. genderED deplores this decision and strongly condemns restrictions on reproductive autonomy. We invite you to read our full statement [here](#).

Hemangini Gupta has a PhD in Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies and moved to Edinburgh from Middlebury College, Vermont where she taught classes in feminist and queer theory and on globalization, technology, and labour.

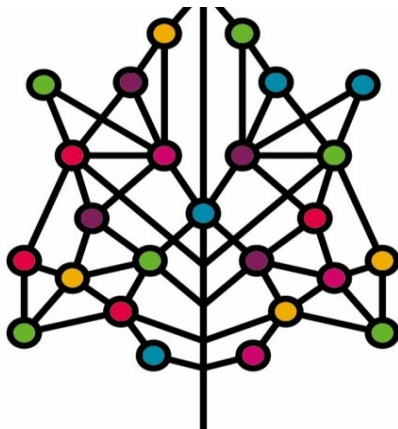
