Announcements

Together with Strathclyde University Feminist Research Network, genderED will be hosting the upcoming SGSSS-SGSAH-funded Spring Into Methods Workshop, 'Doing Feminist Research'. The workshop will run from the 4th to the 6th of May 2022. The workshop will address foundational epistemological and methodological questions that cut across research in the arts & humanities and the social sciences, and tackle dilemmas related to issues of power, positionality, intersectionality, ethics and 'lived experience' in doing research. Attendees will learn from an interdisciplinary team of feminist researchers from the Universities of Edinburgh and Strathclyde. They will be exposed to feminist research projects within academia as well as collaborations between academic and activist contexts. They will have the opportunity to explore different modes of presenting/articulating feminist research, including through creative practice.

Nominations recently closed for genderED and EUSA's new series, **Undergraduate Feminist Trailblazers.** The series aims to showcase the brilliant feminist work being done by undergraduate students at the University of Edinburgh, by highlighting a select number of students and their work. We are excited to share these students' profiles during the summer, and in our future newsletters.
